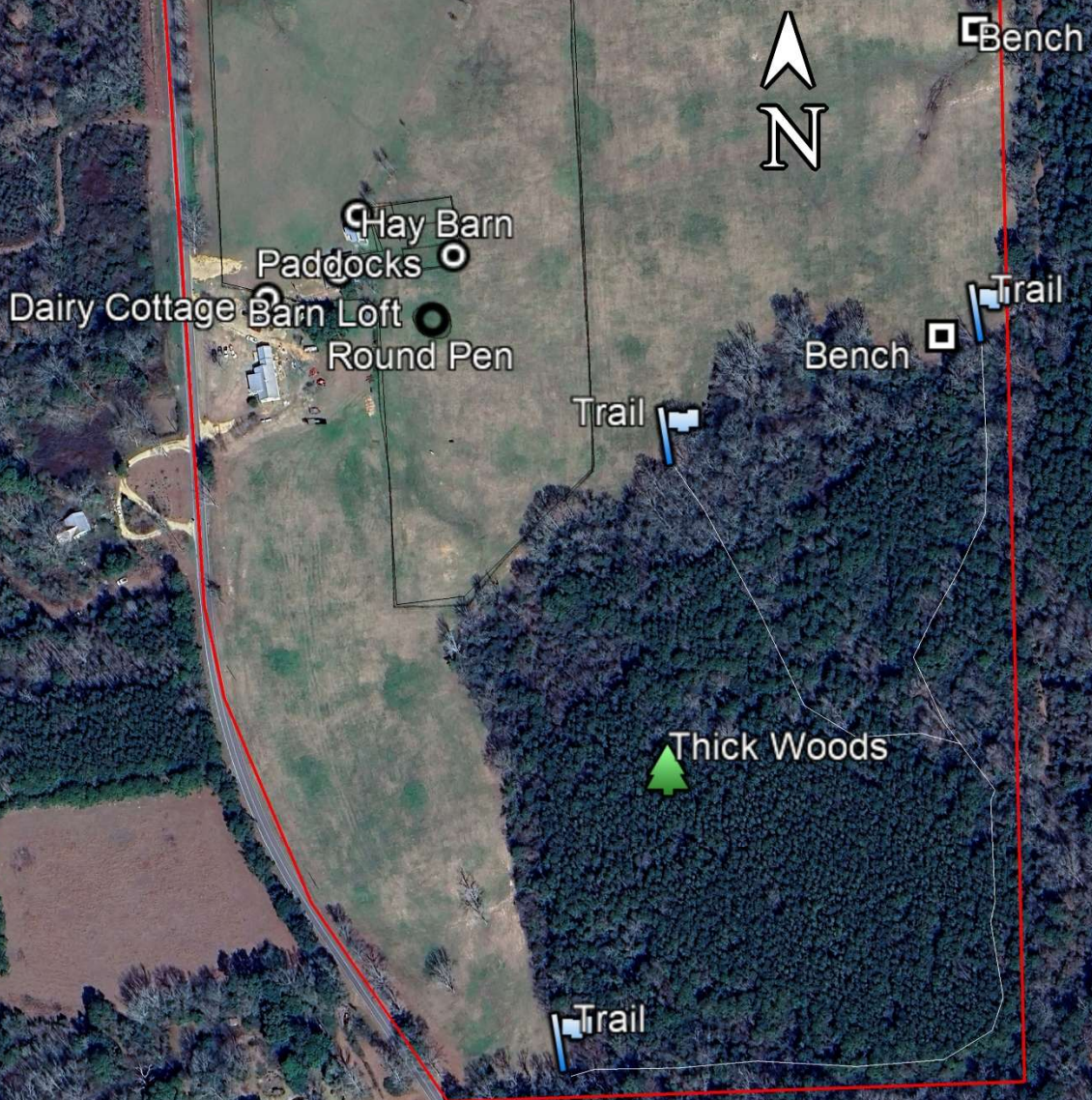

GATES

Windmill Trails offers a higher degree of security with two sets of gates. The gates should be opened and closed upon entry or exit. Thank you for your cooperation.

PARKING INSTRUCTIONS

There is parking available next to the units. Please park straight in and allow room for other vehicles.

Trailers, RV's, boats, motorcycle trailers, campers, fifth wheels, or anything similar are not allowed to be parked in the Farm compound for any circumstance. There is parking available in the adjacent field via a grass apron accessing the highway.

WIFI AND INTERNET STREAMING

The Internet is available via WIFI or connection to cable jacks located in the unit. There is one short cable in the kitchen utility drawer. If there is a need for a computer to be hooked to an ethernet jack, please consider bringing a 25-foot ethernet cable.

The WIFI network is Guest and the password is **lgU!L&i@73**.

Internet video streaming is available using a ROKU box that has various apps to view Netflix, YouTube TV, Amazon video, and more.

HOUSE RULES

Please read the house rules carefully and keep them in mind during your stay. If there is a problem, guests are expected to call or email us at the beginning of the stay with all the issues they may have so that we can assist or correct them.

1. No parties or events allowed.
2. No pets allowed.



3. No smoking allowed.
4. No illegal substances allowed on the premises
5. No pets allowed.
6. Not suitable for toddlers and children under 18.
7. No unregistered guests allowed.
8. Please do not eat or drink in the bedrooms.
9. Please respect the 10 PM to 8 AM noise curfew.
10. Please turn off the AC when you leave.
11. Please run the dishwasher and garbage disposal before leaving.
12. Please turn off lights and appliances when not in use.
13. Please respect check-in and check-out times.
14. Please leave the property in the same condition as when you arrive. This includes washing dishes, taking out the trash, and picking up.
15. Please bag the trash and place it in the garbage can outside your door.
Trash must be bagged.
16. Please take care of the furnishings. You will pay for damages that exceed the security deposit.
17. Please do not rearrange the furniture.

SUPPLIES

A starter supply of bathroom tissue, soap, and paper towels is provided. During their stay, guests must provide additional paper products and household supplies. The guest is responsible for the supply of laundry detergent.

Hair dryers are supplied.

Bed linens and towels are provided. After the guest uses the supply, they must be washed for the duration of the stay.

GARBAGE



There is a standard municipal type rolling garbage container outside the unit for receiving your garbage. Management will take the cart and empty it in the waste container on the driveway by the highway. **YOU MUST BAG ALL OF YOUR GARBAGE. DO NOT PUT ANYTHING LOOSE IN THE CONTAINER.**

SMOKING

Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the unit. Any evidence of smoking within the unit will result in a fine ranging from \$250 to \$1,000 and possible eviction. Absolutely no evidence of smoke, cigarette ashes, butts, or chewing tobacco should be left behind.

SECURITY, FIRST AID, AND FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

SimpliSafe is the security system and uses a 4 digit code using the date of your check in the following format MMDD. Please key the AWAY button to arm the security system and exit. Upon re-entry use the 4 digit code to disarm the security system using just the 4 key strokes of the code. The siren is quite loud.

There are no cameras in the unit.

There are two outdoor cameras on the transformer pole for your security and security of the Farm.

There is a first aid kit in the unit and multiple fire extinguishers...look for the label on the cabinets or door frames for their locations.

OPERATING THE KEYLESS ENTRY LOCK

To LOCK the door:

1. Press the Schlage button



2. Rotate the thumb-turn on the deadbolt to the right, TOWARDS the door opening, engaging the deadbolt.

To UNLOCK the door and enter the home:

1. Enter the access code into the keypad. (A green light will indicate the code is accepted.)

2. Rotate the thumb-turn on the deadbolt to the left, AWAY from the door opening,

unlocking the deadbolt.

** The code may have been entered incorrectly if the light flashes red. Allow 5 seconds for the lock to reset and try again. If the code is entered wrong 3 times in a row, allow a minute before attempting to enter the code**

3. Once unlocked, open the door using the lower door handle.

Note: The door does NOT lock automatically.

DEPARTURE CHECKLIST

Secure the Property: Lock all doors and windows.

Trash & Recycling Disposal: Empty trash cans and bag all waste. Waste bags go in the rolling trash can outside next to the exterior door.

Final Tidying Up: Please return furniture to its place and strip beds if requested.

Canoeing on Magee's Creek and the Bogue Chitto

Magee's Creek and the Bogue Chitto are two Louisiana's best streams for canoeing and kayaking. Horse Trails and Rentals

Equestrian trails at Bogue Chitto State Park are open to riders and their own horses up to 14 miles.

- There is a \$3/horse per day trail fee, in addition to the day-use entrance of \$3 per person.
- Certification of a clean Coggins test is required for all horses brought on State Park property. It is recommended that you call ahead for the status of the trail.
- Bogue Chitto Horse Rentals offers 1-hour, 2-hour and half-day public or private guided rides. They provide horses and all equipment. Free Washington Parish Fair

The Washington Parish Fair happens every year in late October in Franklinton, Louisiana, 20 minutes south of the Farm.

In October of every year, when skies are bluer, and the air is crisp with Fall's first touch, the enthusiastic crowds, larger than ever, once again flow through the front entrance into our beautiful fairgrounds to enjoy the spectacle of the Washington Parish Free Fair.

They come to enjoy the excellent exhibits of cut flowers, homemaking, livestock, and agricultural products. Then there is Old McDonald's Farm and the activities that never seem to cease on the stage. They come to experience the magic of the Midway rides and attractions and the excitement of the PRO Rodeo, and even to just sit a spell under one of the tall pine trees and enjoy the good food.

In addition to all these attractions, there is the Authentic Historical Pioneer Village and the Mile Branch Settlement. Here the visitor will be heartily welcomed by the many costumed hosts and experience a trip into our past as he visits the various log cabins and buildings filled with antiques and hospitality.
